Founded in 2006, Central Jersey College Prep (CJCP) is a public charter school that serves grades K-3 and 6-12. High Honor Roll & Honor Roll: The high honor roll and honor roll serve as an emblem of excellence to recognize students who excel academically. The high honor roll and honor roll lists are prepared at the end of each quarter. They are based on letter grades and include all subjects. The students' who qualify for Principal's List are those with an overall GPA of 4.0 and above GPA. Those who qualify for honor roll are those whom have attained a 3.25 – 3.9 GPA.

Curriculum: At CJCP we strive for academic excellence; which is designed to prepare students for both college and the workplace. We use a year-long schedule with 4 marking periods. CJCP offers Standard Academics, Resource Classes, Honors classes and Advanced Placement Courses. This design allows for varied levels of learning to meet individual student needs. Honors classes are offered in English, Mathematics, Social Studies, and Science.

College credit may be obtained for Advanced Placement (AP) courses and dual enrollment courses offered through Raritan Valley Community College.

Graduation Requirements (2017): Successfully completing a minimum of 132.5 credits in the areas of Language Arts (20 credits), Mathematics (20 credits), Science (15 credits), Social Studies (20 credits incl. two courses in US History), Phys Ed and Health (20 credits), World Languages (10 credits), Visual and Performing Arts (5 credits), Career Education and Consumer, Family, and Life Skills (5 credits), Financial Literacy (2.5 credits), Additional Electives (15 credits)

Each full year course that meets routinely shall yield 5 credits. Semester courses that meet routinely shall yield 2.5 credits

Grade Point Average (GPA)

GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning with grade nine, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. We report weighted GPA on our transcripts. A weighted GPA is computed by multiplying the number of credits per course by the grade achieved in the course multiplied by the weight. The totals for each course are added and then divided by the number of credits taken to compute a student's grade point average. Class rank information is available only upon request. There are two levels of courses utilized for the purpose of calculating weighted grade point average; Advanced Placement (AP) and Honors (H) courses. Standard/College Prep courses are courses not designated AP or H. Honors courses are weighed 1.25, Advanced Placement courses are weighed 1.33.

Advanced Placement Results

In May 2017, 83 took AP Exams

A total of 158 exams were taken in 16 subjects

39% of the AP Exams received scores of 3 or higher
